SHAMROCK had a tent for rest and water for those that wanted to just hear about the ministry, pick up resources and talk about special needs. Admittedly, "rest period" was always a favorite time of the day for me as a youth camp director...but relaxing with special seniors is a new highlight. Hemet Congregation has had their SHAMROCK Ministries introduction, and have started a local newsletter and re-initiated their "buddy system" for daily checks on each other. Visits were made in Hemet, for a Gardena family member hospitalized in the valley and end of life planning and services were provided for a Canoga Park member, Verona Dunlap, which was a nice reunion with "her church."

**IN AUGUST WE HAD ANOTHER SPECIAL EVENT** with good attendance at Temple City to review "Safety Issues for Seniors." Our Apostolic Assistant, David Nii, joined us and was delighted with the fellowship and information. We had a Bank of America representative with us, and Meredith Bischoff taught about internet safety. I reminded everyone of the many facets of abuse that we need to recognize and be prepared to report as ministers if we suspect a senior's fiduciary, physical, mental, environmental or emotional stability is at risk. The website has the PowerPoint presentations available for review for those that missed the event. Food from our favorite caterer Sally and piano entertainment funded by Mary Lou Ash made for a great day. The Burbank and Orange Congregations hosted a SHAMROCK presentation and both congregations have received follow up calls and visits with members. We even had a request from Independence for a Shamrock visit to a visiting and hospitalized senior, which was a delight as I



got to re-connect with daughter who is on the Canoga Park rolls. Anaheim had a special need for advocacy for a member who began this month assisting with serious health needs. Apostle Scott Murphy and the Health Ministry Association have both requested information and articles on the direct impact of the SHAMROCK ministry...exciting!!! Jim and Jan Albin checked in and coordinated four home visits with seniors in the Upland area, and that was a highlight of my month to meet new and cherished people in their homes. **SEPTEMBER STARTED** off with some new opportunities. I did a remote PowerPoint presentation to the participants of the GALA retreat at Samish Island (in Washington) related to the aging issues of our GLBT members, and will stay available for future needs as requested. I visited Bessie from Orange, and helped Janet and Mike, with the assistance of a new referral agency, to find a charming and competent board and care home for her long term needs in Long Beach.

**HOME VISITS** were made for members in Anaheim, Santa Barbara, Ventura, Simi Valley and Gardena. The Simi Valley Congregation had their SHAMROCK presentation. Thanks to a generous contribution by Elaine Jacobson of Santa Barbara, "Senior Manna Bags" were assembled for needs that are discovered through calls and visits. We had a great Indian Briyani lunch provided by Leela and

reviewed local resources and those in greatest need. Two special people got health advocacy visits, but it was a sad day when Anna Herrington (of Anaheim) died. I was blessed to participate in the celebration of Marshall Von Bierberstein's 92 years of making a difference in his community.

**SEPTEMBER WAS ALSO MY MONTH FOR MEETINGS AND EDUCATION** in Independence, including the helpful HMA conference on "Health and Spirituality" highlighted by President David Schaal's insightful opening thoughts. I also attended an Ethics and Mental Health Conference in Kansas City on "Compassionate Conversations for End of Life Planning for Seniors." For the next six weeks, I will be in classes here at home to finish my Parish Nurse Certificate, along with work on some grants for sustainable services going into 2011.

**G**rowing old is not for sissies! One of the disadvantages is that our bodies and reflexes no longer function smoothly. One of the advantages is that we can enjoy selective memories.

After my 85<sup>th</sup> birthday in August, Denise Leichter and Jan and Jim Albin came to visit me. That is one of my special, selective memories. Their visit was prompted by the relatively new Shamrock ministry.

While they were explaining this program, they listened to me brag that I was in good shape for an old woman with the help of glasses, hearing aids, partial plates, and several kinds of medicine. Kindly, they agreed with me although I'm about 20 lbs. overweight with sagging and blemished skin, varicose veins, and thinning hair. I didn't mention the time I killed a raisin thinking it was a housefly! Nor the many times I put something away in a special place then forgot where that was.

I showed them around my apartment, proudly pointing out articles crafted and gifted to me by special relatives and friends. **They listened and admired.**

Although I do not own a car, I told them how I maintain my independence by using my 4-wheel shopping cart. I explained that I live in an area with a variety of interesting places to shop, eat and satisfy special needs, all within walking distance. **They listened and were impressed.**

I showed them pictures of my family and told them I had two married sons and adult grandchildren available if I needed help. Because I value my independence, I prefer to take care of my needs myself whenever possible. **They listened and understood.**

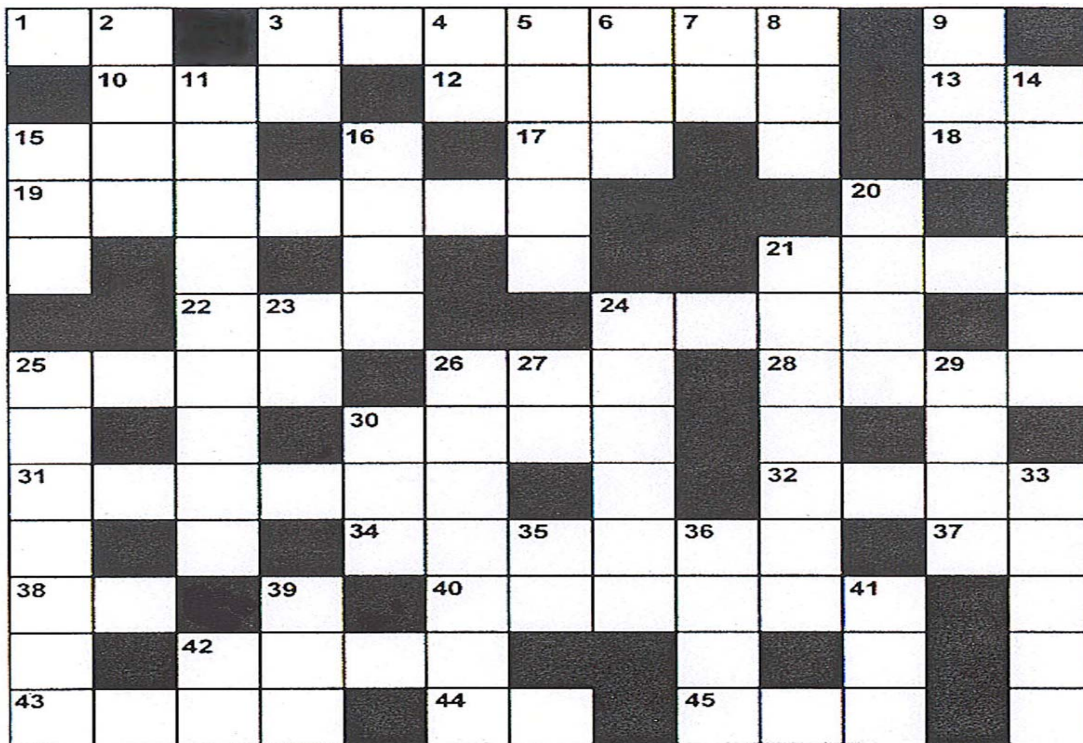
I told them how blessed I am to have someone willing to take me to and from church. I shared my appreciation of my current driver. Laura, a recent widow, and her father Fred, who lives with her, drive several blocks out of their way to pick me up on Sunday mornings. Laura drives a pick-up truck with a back seat. When they arrive at my apartment, they both get out of the front seat. Using his cane, Fred, who is older than me, climbs in the back seat so that I can sit with Laura. Because the truck sits too far off the ground for my short legs, Laura places a small stool near the front door so I can climb in. Then she shuts my door, puts the stool back in the truck, climbs in behind the steering wheel and off we go to church. I call her thoughtfulness "going the extra mile." **My visitors listened and concurred.**

I learned important facts about the Shamrock ministry and visiting with Denise, Jan and Jim was the highlight of my week. **Because they listened to me, they made me feel special. 🍀**

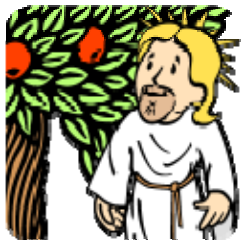

Al said: “I’d like them to say, ‘Look, he’s moving!’”

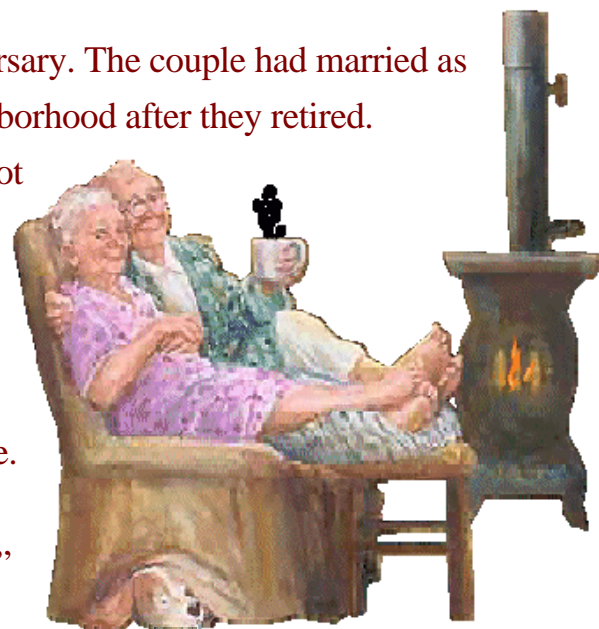
## NO ONE BELIEVES SENIORS . . . EVERYONE THINKS THEY ARE SENILE

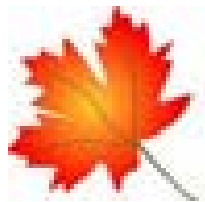

Why build you this bridge at eventide?”*



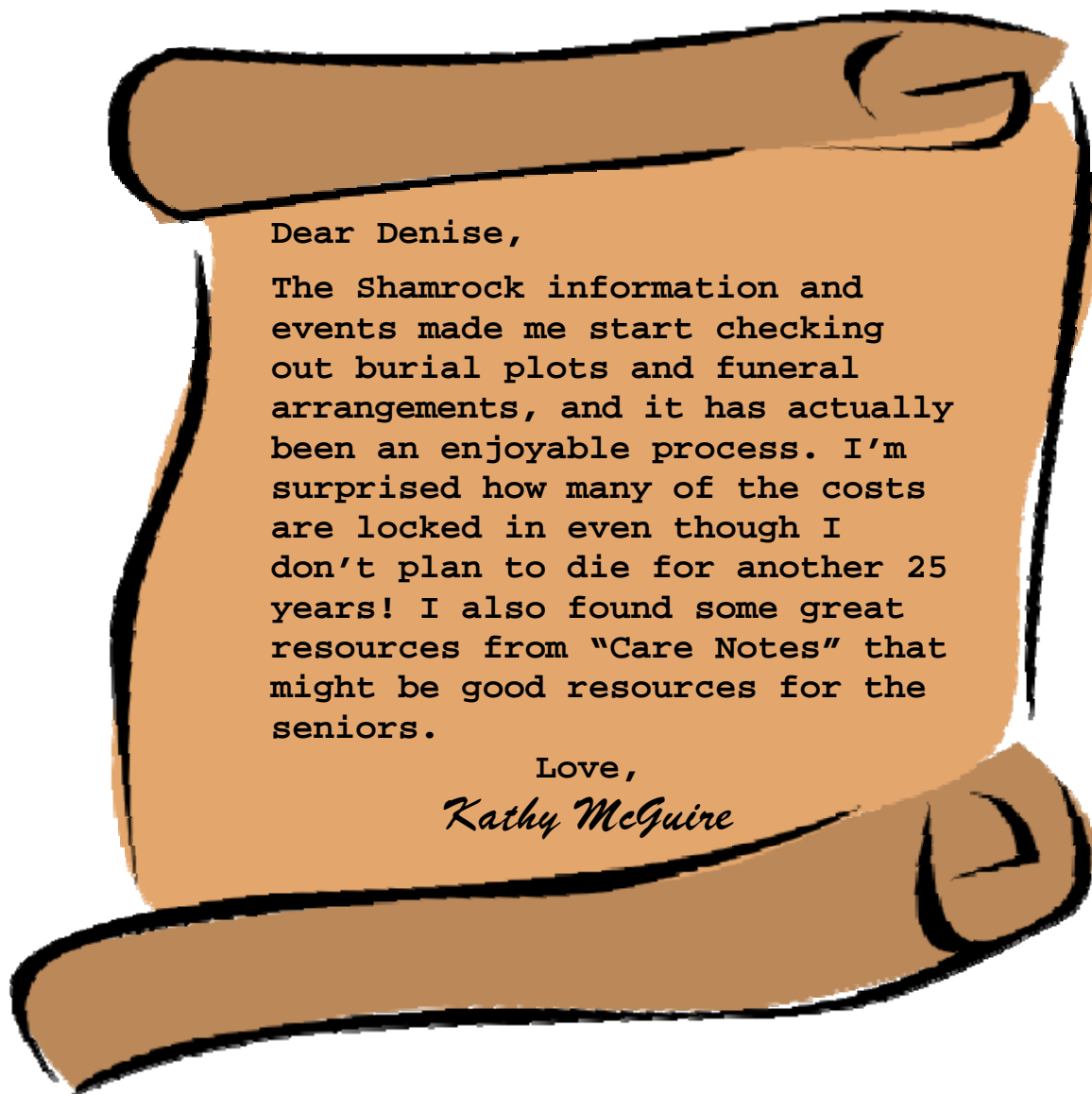
*The builder lifted his old gray head,

**September 23** was the day some very important changes happened in healthcare reform through the Affordable Care Act. Contact your providers for details of changes impacting you.

- ▶ Insurers must cover routine preventative care (like mammograms). Get one as needed.
- ▶ October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month
- ▶ Insurers will not be able to charge you more for using out-of-network hospitals you need for emergency services.
- ▶ Lifetime limits on your insurance will go away.
- ▶ You can't be dropped from coverage because of errors in processing your paperwork.



**A**ging seems to be the only available way to live a longer life...so when you wake up each morning, make up your mind to have a GREAT day because LIFE is 10% what happens to you and 90% what you do with what happens to you!

There are LOTS of options for monitor devices for staying at home safely. We would like to hear what types you use, and why you selected the one you have. Shamrock Ministries provided Sam Rose from Hemet an assortment of options for Jerry and the family to consider. They selected the Philips Lifeline because of the added feature related to falls. Do you need names and contact information? Please tell us your stories about products you use.

**4<sup>TH</sup> QUARTER ADMITTANCES** of seniors to hospitals are related to dehydration (don't stop drinking lots of fluids even when it gets colder), flu (do you need a vaccination?), pneumonia (cough into elbows and reduce some of the community hugging and kissing), strokes, congestive heart failure (dietary changes over holidays), and medication mismanagement. Make sure you take all your medications with you if you travel, and a current **MEDICATION LIST** with physician and pharmacy names and phone numbers.



## **1500'S HISTORY AS SHARED BY CASEY FORGY FROM THE GARDENA CONGREGATION**

The next time you are washing your hands and complain because the water temperature isn't just how you like it, think about how things used to be.

Most people got married in June because they took their yearly bath in May, and they still smelled pretty good by June. However, since they were starting to smell a little bit, the brides carried a bouquet of flowers to hide the body odor; hence, the custom of carrying a bouquet when getting married. Baths consisted of a big tub filled with hot water. The man of the house had the privilege of the nice clean and hot water. Then all the other sons and men, then the women, and finally the children bathed. Last of all the babies were put in. By then the water was so dirty you could lose someone in it. Hence the saying, "Don't throw the baby out with the bath water!"

Lead cups were used to drink ale and whiskey a long time ago, and the combination of lead and alcohol used to knock people out for days, so family would take them home and lay them out on the kitchen table for a few days and eat and drink with friends and wait to see if they would wake up, and the custom stuck of holding a "wake."



WHEN SMALL ENGLISH COMMUNITIES ran out of places to bury people, they would dig up coffins, take bones to the “bone house” and re-use the grave. When reopening these coffins, one out of 25 had scratch marks on the inside and they realized they had buried some people alive! So they started to tie a string on the wrist of the corpse, lead it through the coffin and up through the ground and tie it to a bell. Someone would have to sit out in the graveyard all night (graveyard shift) to listen for the bell; thus someone could “be saved by the bell” or was considered a “dead ringer.” Good education, trivia, or fun to share over a Halloween meal?

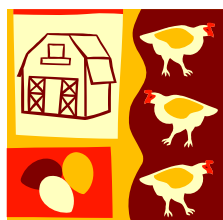
